Instructions: Students should use this hyperdoc to complete the week's lesson and activities. The "Engage" section starts with a short warm up based on the video that is linked. Students should watch the video and type out their responses in the box. Next, move to the "Explore" section and check out both the articles. These will be important for understanding the lesson, which is contained in "Explain". Students should watch the ScreenCastify and use the lesson to complete their two-column notes. Make sure after the lesson to use the Kahoot challenge and the exit ticket to reflect (the exit ticket will help me to reflect, too!) and at the end you will need to make a choice and complete ONE of the three options that are provided.



Engage
